One or Nothing is Arkiv Vilmansa's inaugural exhibition in Singapore. The exhibition details the phenomenal success of an artist who recently held his first solo exhibition, Through The Lines, in the United States back in February this year. While at first glance reminiscent of Anthony Ausgang's MGMT Congratulations cover art, Arkiv's signature work mixes fluid, curvaceous lines with rich, extravagant colours to draw appeal on abstract ideas that is at once captivating and thoughtprovoking. One or Nothing puts quintessentially Singaporean icons under the spotlight, engaging audiences to appreciate famous icons and figures that define the exponential growth of a nation and its distinctive melting pot of cultures.



STRUCK BY LIGHTNING SOLD

Local comedian Kumar most famously described himself as a Merlion - a half-lion and half-mermaid creature (go figure!) that is Singapore's most popular mascot. The abstract symbolism that gave it its name has since been adopted in colloquial usage to describe – well, vomiting. This mythical creature can be seen at five locations around the island, and continues to decorate key-chains, fridge magnets and T-shirts, bought in the dozens as souvenirs by tourists from all over the world. The Merlion was struck by lightning – yes, lightning, not a PAP lawsuit - in 2009.



MASQUERADE ON WHEELS

Translated as 'The Art of Masquerade', Singapore's annual Chingay parade has evolved into one of Asia's most magnificent street and floats parades since its humble beginnings in 1973. A showstopper every year, the Chingay is a stunning extravaganza of vibrant and dazzling floats celebrating cultural diversity with both local and foreign performing groups. Symbolising the lasting success of the Chingay is the Phoenix, a mythical, sacred firebird that is the trademark icon at every parade. When it draws near to its 500-year life cycle, it self-immolates and majestically rises anew from the ashes.



A FEMINIST'S NIGHTMARE SOLD

Better known for its exemplary in-flight service and the stringent Holy Grail selection of its flight crew, Singapore Airlines is the five-star flight carrier airline of Singapore. Its reputation spans across the globe with the Singapore Girl, the epitome of beauty and Asian hospitality dressed in Sarong Kebaya first designed by Pierre Balmain in 1968. The flag carrier more recently rode on the novelty of being the first to fly the Airbus A380 with a US\$8.6 billion fleet purchase. Money can indeed buy you everything.



PURPLE THUMBS

What's your fondest memory of Singapore's first savings bank? Established in 1877 by the British Government, POSB reminds us more than fuzzy childhood memories and the day when a smiling lady behind a counter imprinted our little thumbs with purple ink. The POSB Squirrel Savers' Club was first set up to encourage children to save – and save we must! In the face of transport hikes, ever increasing taxes and ERP charges, we begin to understand the importance of saving money...



ONE THOUSAND AND ONE FLAMINGOS

A world-famous bird aviary boasting more species of birds than any other bird zoo on the planet, the Jurong Bird Park just boosted its facilities with a S\$10 million makeover. Think primary school excursions, wholesome family outings and busy Japanese tourists (or MP Tin Pei Ling) furiously snapping kawaii photographs. The iconic parrots that make up the logo remind us of the flamboyant parrot paradise and Quincy the Yellow-headed Amazon.



MISS SINGAPORE FLOWER 1981

Named after a horticulturist who gave us the Singapore Orchid, Vanda Miss Joaquim is a hybrid of – ok, let's leave out complicated flowery (pun intended) names. Though hardly an ubiquitous sight in gardens these days, this delicate hybrid has served as Singapore's national flower since 1981. Its unique violet-rose colour distinguished it from the pageant of 40 other flowers in the running for symbolic status – proof that even flora in Singapore can be endorsed with 'Number One' status. Arkiv has chosen to give this winning flower his own vibrant rendition.



DOUBLE BABY BONUS

While most of us lament the 2012 Mayan Doomsday, overzealous kiasu parents now have a reason to rejoice – 2012 is also the Year of the Dragon! Forget Western influences and cosmopolitan values (whatever that means), Dragon babies are still a symbol of longevity and wealth in Singapore. While parents set their agenda for a productive – ehh, reproductive year ahead, singles now have a bigger concern: overcrowded buses, trains and more competition.



TAKE FLIGHT

Arkiv Vilmansa takes off in Singapore with 'One or Nothing', a course of kaleidoscopic illustrations that stemmed from the artist's love for birds and his endearing visits to the Jurong Bird Park. Take time to explore the eleven paintings and observe the perfect amalgamation of lines, colours and childhood inspiration. 
THE BREAST THINGS IN LIFE

Arkiv successfully manages to capture the Dragon's ferociousness, elegance and grandiosity that inspired Lawrence Ferlinghetti's "The Great Chinese Dragon" in his 1961 anthology Starting from San Francisco.



THICK AND SWEET SOLD

We're actually talking about Singapore's very own (really?) local favourite: The Chilli Crab! Forget glamour, poise and chichi fine dining, Arkiv is always ready to sweat out a plate of stir-fried mud crabs sitting in thick, simmering sweet and spicy gravy whenever he's in town. Ranked 45th on CNN Go's World's 50 most delicious foods 2011, adventurous tourists and locals alike would be more than familiar with this popular Singaporean dish. Watch seasoned eaters fight for the limited pincers and mantous while the ang mohs sweat in exasperation. Everyone, say Ho jiak!
